Chapter 2

Chapter 3

10. Humility is eternal love clothing itself in meekness and gentleness, to win, to save and to serve us.

Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: BUT MADE HIMSELF OF NO REPUTATION, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men.

11. Humility is the rescue from the dual offer of Satan which was to be great like God, to know good and evil and to not need God.

Satan's offer was an offer of self-help, self-establishment, independence, greatness, self-guidance, self-knowledge, self-decisions, and self-choices.

And the devil said unto him, If thou be the Son of God, command this stone that it be made bread. And Jesus answered him, saying, It is written, That man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God. And the devil, taking him up into an high mountain, shewed unto him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time. And the devil said unto him, All this power will I give thee, and the glory of them: for that is delivered unto me; and to whomsoever I will I give it.

If thou therefore wilt worship me, all shall be thine. And Jesus answered and said unto him, Get thee behind me, Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve. And he brought him to Jerusalem, and set him on a pinnacle of the temple, and said unto

him, If thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down from hence: For it is written, He shall give his angels charge over thee, to keep thee: And in their hands they shall bear thee up, lest at any time thou dash thy foot against a stone. And Jesus answering said unto him, It is said, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God. And when the devil had ended all the temptation, he departed from him for a season.

12. Humility is salvation.

Salvation is to, essentially, be redeemed from pride and a terrible nature that destroys everything. Salvation in its essential nature is to be made humble or to re-introduce the chief grace that we lost in the fall.

13. Humility is to be like Christ.

It is Christlikeness. Christ is the perfect embodiment of true humility and dependence on God and also of the nothingness that we lost in the garden.

The humility of Christ was not a temporary, transient, occasional sentiment of feeling that came when He sinned or was in a crisis. It showed us Christ's essential heart and nature.

The main aim of Christ was to be nothing so His father could express Himself through Him fully.

The first and the chief marks of Christ within us must now be to learn of Him this great humility. When we learn of Christ, we will discover a new life of self-renunciation, absolute submission, nothingness and dependence that is entirely peaceful, joyful and centred on the Lord.

Chapter 4

Nine Things Jesus Taught about Humility

1. The blessings of Heaven are for the humble who have nothing.

Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 5:3

2. The blessings of the earth are for the humble, who think of themselves as nothing.

Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.

Matthew 5:5

3. Happiness in our lives will be obtained in the life of humility.

Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and YE SHALL FIND REST UNTO YOUR SOULS.

4. The principal thing Jesus exuded and exemplified was meekness and holiness; and that is what He wants us to learn of Him.

5. Humility will be the chief distinguisher of people in Heaven. By humility we find our rank in the kingdom.
